

### SAGRADA FAMILIA


Visit one of the most iconic buildings of Barcelona that has been under construction for over a century.

Park Guell is one of the most beautiful places in the city.


The park is located in the upper part of the town, where you can enjoy wonderful views of Barcelona.

#### WHAT TO VISIT



### CASA VICENS

It is a modernist building situated in the Gràcia neighbourhood. The first great project of Gaudí (1883–1888), clearly influenced by oriental architecture, which fascinated the architect at a time when Arab salons proliferated in the city.

EXTRA TIP



#### CASA MILA

Casa Milà, popularly known as La Pedrera was the last private residence designed by architect Antoni Gaudí and was built between 1906 and 1912.



### PALAU GUELL

The Palau Güell is a mansion designed by Gaudi for Eusebi Güell's that had a dual function: on one hand, to house his large family and on the other, to host all the events of his active social life.

### COLONIA GUELL



This gem is located 23km from Barcelona, but you can easily get here by train. It was built as a industrial colony for the workers of the Guell Factory, on a hillside in Santa Coloma de Cervelló.


GRAN TEATRE DE Liceu

MIRADOR DE COLOM

The Columbus
monument which the
tower is above the port
area at the foot of Las
Ramblas offers the
traveler a 60 metres
high vantage point
from which to view Las
Ramblas.





CATEDRAL DE BARCELONA

This magnificent
Cathedral is
dedicated to the
martyr Santa
Eulàlia, the patron
saint of Barcelona.

#### SANTA MARIA DEL MAR

Among the most beautiful churches in Barcelona, Santa María del Mar is a peaceful oasis in the midst of a tremendously busy city and is most definitely worth a visit.


### PLAÇA REIAL

One of the most famous squares in Barcelona is Plaça Reial. It is located directly next to Las Ramblas. Surrounded by palm trees, here you can find some popular nightclubs, bars and restaurants.



**EL CALL JUEU** 

The Jewish Quarter is a pretty labyrinth of alleys. These are some of the narrowest streets in all of Barcelona where Jewish merchants played an important role in city life.



### PALAU DE LA MUSICA CATALANA

The Palau de la Música
Catalana is an
architectural jewel of
Catalan Art Nouveau,
the only concert venue
in this style to be listed
as a World Heritage
Site by UNESCO, which
today represents an
essential landmark in
the cultural and social
life of Catalonia.

Go vintage shopping at Carrer D'Avinyo.

Pay attention to your step at Las Ramblas to find the famous Mosaico de Miró.

#### WHAT TO VISIT



### ARC DE TRIOMPH

The Arc de Triomf was built as the gateway to a fair which was held in the Parc de la Ciutadella. Today it continues to serve as the finishing point for several marathons and charity races, as well as a

venue for a number of

music festivals.





### POBLE ESPAÑOL

Here you have the soul of Spain concentrated in a single space. Its constructions are scale reproductions of streets of different regions of Spain.

### MONASTERY OF **PEDRALBES**

Certainly one of the most beautiful gothic buildings in Barcelona. Built in the early 14th century, it shows the everyday life of the nuns, while its Museum exhibits objects of ecclesiastical art from the 14th to the 20th centuries.



#### MONTJUIC CASTLE

Previously used to repress the anarchists in the 19th century, and political prisoners under Franco's regime, it currently serves as a Barcelona municipality's facility. It is open to the public and guests can explore the grand historical grounds.

#### MUHBA


Museu d'Historia de Barcelona (MUHBA) exhibits the archaeological excavation of the Gothic Quarter which was accidentally discovered in the 1920s. See an ensemble of medieval buildings and Roman ruins that represent the foundation of Barcelona.

#### CAMP NOU

After the Sagrada
Familia, the Camp
Nou is undoubtedly
the other temple of
the city. It is the
largest stadium in
Spain and Europe.
Its tour lasts around
2 hours. The FC
Barcelona Museum,

million visitors a
year.



### FUNDACIÓ JOAN MIRÓ

On Montjuïc

Mountain,
integrated into the
landscape while
retaining its own
personality, you will
find the Fundació
Joan Miró building,
a major work of
Rationalist
architecture that is
home to 14,000
pieces by the
Catalan artist.

# BORN CULTURAL AND MEMORIAL CENTRE

One of the most remarkable iron architecture markets in Barcelona is home to an important modern age archaeological site.



#### CCCB

The CCCB is a cultural centre dedicated to the contemporary culture of Barcelona, It organizes excellent exhibitions and the building is a perfect example of architectural renewal. It's a great place for visitors to learn about the history of the city's culture from fields and perspectives that range from architecture, multimedia, design, and literature.

### **MONTSERRAT**

Montserrat is a spectacularly beautiful mountain about one hour North West from Barcelona by train.

Not only is Montserrat Monastery of significant religious importance but the natural beauty surrounding the monastery is simply breathtaking.

If you enjoy walking, there are also some interesting roads through the mountains where you will experience magnificent views of some of the most unusual rock formations in the whole of Catalonia.

### MONTJUÏC

Montjuïc is one of Barcelona's green lungs and it offers some of the best city views. This little world of history, gardens, museums, cultural centres and Olympic facilities makes it unique. The imposing hill looks towards the port and offers you an impressive city landscape. Do not miss the spectacular display of colour, light, motion, music and water acrobatics at the magic fountain.



### **TIBIDABO**

Tibidabo is a hill
overlooking Barcelona, it
is the tallest hill in the
Serra de Collserola. Rising
sharply to the north-west,
it has views over the city
and the surrounding
coastline.

The summit of the hill is occupied by the Sagrat Cor church and adjacent Tibidabo's Amusement Park.




### CIUTADELLA Park

Ciutadella is the biggest park in Barcelona. You can rent a boat to row on the lake, take a walk or jog around. Do not forget to admire the beautiful fountain that a young Antoni Gaudí had a hand in creating.



## THE HORTA LABYRINTH PARK

Go for the labyrinth that gives the park its name. Stay for the lovely ponds, stream and waterfall, footbridges, paths and plenty of amazing trees that just invite you to take a few calming deep breaths.




### POBLENOU CENTRAL PARK

#### OLD PORT

Port Vell commences
at the end of
Barcelona's La
Rambla, by the
Columbus monument,
the Port Vell is the
oldest part of the
Port of Barcelona,
converted into a
space of reference
for locals and
tourists and perfectly
integrated into the
urban life of the city.



#### BARCELONETA BEACH

Located in the traditional fishing district, this is one of Barcelona's oldest and best-loved beaches. La Barceloneta is known for its sandy beach and its many restaurants and nightclubs along the boardwalk.



#### AQUARIUM

The marine aquarium is located in Port Vell. It has 35 aquariums holding six million litres of sea water featuring 11,000 sea creatures from 450 different species, and claims to be the biggest aquarium in Europe. Each tank of the marine aquarium simulates a different sea region, such as the tropical and mediterranean tanks.

#### **ELS QUATRE GATS**

The café opened on June 12, 1897 in the famous Casa Martí, and served as a hostel, bar and cabaret until it eventually became a central meeting point for Barcelona's most prominent modernist figures, such as Pablo Picasso and Ramon Casas i Carbó.



#### EL BOSC DE FADES

At the cafe,
you'll find trees,
illusory mirrors,
music, and
simulated
rainstorms that
are all part of the
experience.




### ICE BARCELONA

Unusual and thrilling, IceBarcelona is an overall body experience as you are provided with warm jackets upon entering the bar filled with ice. Set at minus five degrees Celsius, sculptures and ice blocks fill the interior as you shiver yourself through this ice palace.





### NIGHT LIFE



#### PORT OLIMPIC

Right on the waterfront, the compound of restaurants, lounge bars and dance clubs around this area make it the city's main playground for the grownups. The most popular clubs are Pacha, CDLC, Opium and Shoko. A dress code does help getting through the picky bouncers.



### **GOTHIC QUARTER**

Here you will find spots hidden away in dark corners, such as the stylish Milk Bar, which has a great cocktail menu or the L'Ascensor. Plaza Real is a great place with bars as the hidden Pipa Club and famous clubs like Jamboree, Sidecar and nearby the Marula Café. Get around the street Ample for more bar options.



#### **EL RAVAL**

The heart of the district is the Rambla de Raval where you can find hip bars like Ambar. In Raval you can find great options as L'Ovella Negra, La Confiteria, Two Schmucks, Casa Almirall or Somnia. Check the London Bar (opened the 1910) which used to be frequented by the likes of Dalí, Picasso and Hemingway. For clubbing choose the famous Sala Apolo.

### DO AS THE LOCALS

In Gracia you'll find a very Catalan crowd, with not too many tourists. Try the Bloody Mary Coctail Bar, El Ciclista or for vermouth lovers Las Vermudas. Check the Gracia Latina for live Cuban music or salsa classes.

# FIGUERES AND DALI MUSEUM


A trip to the Dalí

#### PORT AVENTURA

Spend a day in this amusement park
Park in Salou which attracts around 3.5 million visitors per year, making it the most visited theme park in Spain and the sixth most visited theme park in Europe



#### TARRAGONA

In this effervescent port city, Roman history collides with beaches, bars and a food scene that perfumes the air with freshly grilled seafood. The biggest lure is the wealth of ruins in Spain's secondmost important Roman site, including a mosaicpacked museum and a seaside

amphitheatre.



#### BESALU

Besalú is a dreamy place, a village that seems to come out of a fairy tale. is a magnificent example of a medieval town. Cobbled streets and facades and a wonderful bridge are the trademarks of Besalu.

#### CADAQUES

Cadaqués is one of the most emblematic locations of the landscape and of the fishing tradition of the Costa Brava. At the head of Cadaqués bay is its historic quarter, with a Mediterranean air and deep seaside flavour.

SITGES

Sitges is known for its Mediterranean beaches and seafront promenade lined up with grand mansions and restaurants.



**CASTELLDEFELS** 

Castelldefels is an idyllic beach town with golden Mediterranean beaches and impressive mountains that surround the bay, ideal for a relaxed and scenic day.



GARRAF

Follow the rugged cliffs down to the sea, and you will find the quiet coastal town of Garraf, a former fishing village with a peaceful stretch of golden sand.





In Sant Pol de Mar, you'll discover a fishermen's town, with white houses and narrow, quiets streets, rocky bays and heavy-grained sand beaches bathed with crystal-clear waters.


### **CRUILLA**

# festa major

Barcelona's festes majors are the most authentic parties in town, and completely free to attend. Throughout the year, the city's different neighborhoods take turn hosting their own version of the festa major.



LA MERCÉ

Barcelona's Festa Major
(LA MERCÉ) is a macro
festival made up of various
individual festivals that
showcase Barcelona's
cultural wealth; from the La
Mercè Street Art Festival,
to displays of popular
culture. Usually they offer
over five hundred activities
in total.



FESTA MAJOR DE Gracia

If you are in Barcelona in August make sure that you head to the up town district of Gràcia to see what this unique festival is all about. The concept of Gràcia festival is that streets in the neighbourhood compete to win the prize of being the best decorated street.



### **TRADITIONS**



#### ELS CASTELLS

"Castell" means castle in Catalan. The aim of this cultural activity is to build a human castle. The origins of this tradition dates back to the 18th century. It was in the small town of Valls that the inhabitants started building the towers, The individual groups (colles) compete in sporting events.



#### CORREFOC

The origin of the Correfocs dates back to the 12th Century. You'll see people dressed as devils and demons running with fireworks, dancing to music, or occasionally swallowing fire. This tradition takes place as part of La Merce, Sant Joan, and the Festes Majors of the neighborhoods.



#### SARDANA

It is a group circle dance. This tradition has been hailed throughout the 19th Century. At that time the Catalans claimed their identity and this dance became one of its symbols, so in some sense it remarks a strong cultural difference with the rest of Spain.
